This is a survey course about the history of education in the Ottoman Empire which presents an introductory reading to attain a general view. The survey begins with the pre-Ottoman higher educational issues of Medieval Islam. Following that, students will be introduced to the issue of "Ottoman madrasa" as an institution, with its political and academic functions. The sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth centuries will be discussed particularly with a focus on the cultural-educational history in development. Politics and education, social and economic crises and education, and the radical changes in the intellectual horizons will be topics of these weeks. Education, from the perspective of this course, is taken a bit broader. It encompasses the socio-cultural aspects of education in the Empire but together with that the scholarly aspects together with religion-politics will be included. Therefore, throughout the course, you will have readings in a wide spectrum stretching from the discussion about the Ottoman madrasa curriculum to the structures of patronage among the scholars.

#### REQUIREMENTS

- A. Quizzes (20 pts): There will be 2 quizzes, (For better performance in the quizzes you should complete your readings <u>before</u> the class hour. Quizzes are composed of multiple-choice questions.
- **B. Midterm Exam (20 pts): There are two parts of this exam:**15 pts for <u>one essay question</u>, 10 pts for multiple-choice questions.5
- C. Final Exam (40 pts): There are two parts of this exam: 25 pts two essay questions, 20 pts test questions.
